Supporting Competitive tennis — We will also be exploring ways in which we might support the Club Captain both for continuity purposes and in particular for the men, help us to rebuild a stronger base of players to improve the opportunities for competitive mens tennis. We have already had some expressions of interest but please do come and see me if this interests you.

Membership development – Just recently we've seen the Rotary backed Free Tennis events generate some good firm interest and there are plans developed to follow up opportunities on the recruiting the "missing generation" also know as the 18 to 40's and fingers crossed this is starting to show some progress.

The Coaching Programme will see further development and on a personal note can I say for those that may have been a bit like me in thinking "you can't teach an old dog new tricks" well I can report that after a winter of discontent, thanks to Cary's patience and to the amusement of my cotrainees, I finally have the early makings of a topspin backhand, OK Very Much a work in progress for those that have seen it and I probably shouldn't mention how many coaching balls ended up in neighbouring gardens but if
